The Senior Apartments is under a fire watch until the sprinkler system is back up. Zero people used the warming station at the Fire Station. Asst. Chief Ogden stated Engine 10 had some warranty work done on the wipers. Medic 81 had the front tires replaced. He also stated the refrigerator at the Station went down and no one will work on it, so we got a new refrigerator. Asst. Chief Ogden commented Probationary FF Eli Crane passed class for EMT and will have his final test for EMT. Probationary FF Lucas Jones passed the Hazmat Awareness and is taking EMT class. He thanked everyone who attended the Christmas Breakfast and thanked the Council for the Christmas Dinner and gift. Asst. Chief Ogden stated there are three candidates at this point for the application process.

Enforcement Division: Mayor Dolezal stated the improvements at Needler's are nice.

Mayor Dolezal thanked everyone for showing up.
