City of Tipton Common Council Public Hearing held on July 16, 2018 at Tipton City Hall, Council Chambers, Tipton.

Members: Mayor Havens, Councilmen Curnutt, Morgan, Ogden and Rippy and Clerk-Treasurer Clark. Councilman Clark was not present.

Others: Sherry Landseadel County Commissioner Mark Manier and Tipton Tribune – Vicky Boyd.

Mayor Havens opened the July 16, 2018 Public Hearing at 5:15 p.m.

Mayor Havens reported the purpose of the hearing is to hear from the public on Ordinance 2018-05. An Ordinance Annexing Certain Territory Contiguous To The City Of Tipton, Indiana, Placing The Same Within The Corporate Boundaries Thereof And Making The Same Part Of The City Of Tipton. He also reported Ordinance 2018-05 was passed on first reading June 25, 2018 and will be considered again in two weeks on July 30th, 2018 along with the Resolution adopting the Fiscal Plan which goes with this Ordinance. Mayor Havens asked if the Public Hearing was properly advertised and if the appropriate amount of time has passed. Clerk-Treasurer Clark stated yes. He also reported Vicky Boyd is here as the press, Sherry Landseadel was here and Commissioner Manier was present and to address in support of the Ordinance. Commissioner Manier reported all three Commissioners are in support of the Ordinance and will be good neighbors.

Mayor Havens reported we will wait until 5:25 p.m. to see if anyone else from the public shows up and addresses this Ordinance. Boyd with the Tribune asked if the Council would be taking action tonight on the Ordinance. Clerk-Treasurer Clark stated no, tonight is only the public hearing. Boyd stated July 30th will be the official adoption if passed. Mayor Havens reported there has to be a 14-day period after the public hearing before it can be adopted. Mayor Havens asked if the four Councilmembers would be available for the meeting on July 30th. They advised yes that is the plan.

Mayor Havens reported he opened the public hearing at 5:15 p.m. and the only member from the public was Commissioner Manier and he was in support and on behalf of the Tipton County Board of Commissioners. There was no other member of the public who was here for or against. We held the hearing open for 10 minutes and no other public attended. Mayor Havens entertained a motion to close the public hearing.
