- Mayor Havens introduced Mr. Oliver Wise, Field Representative for Congresswoman Susan Brooks. He stated Mr. Wise is here for public meetings on the second Wednesday of every month.
- Minutes: Councilman Morgan made a motion to approve the January 14, 2019, Council minutes without amendment, seconded by Councilman Rippy, with all in favor.

Amend Agenda: Nothing to report.

BOW: Councilman Curnutt reported from the January 28, 2019 BOW meeting.

- GAC: Councilman Chandler reported we have been on recess for the winter, we will have a meeting February 2019.
- Goodwill: Councilman Rippy reported the Committee met on January 18, 2019, at Jim Dandy. He also stated we met all the new County Council and County Commissioners. We had a good discussion.
- District Solid Waste Board: Councilman Morgan reported Dr. Mullins is President, Mayor Don Havens is Vice President, Commission Manier is Treasurer and Director Heron is Secretary. Mayor Havens discussed the trade tariff issues and the largest depositories for recycling in China.
- Street Alley & Sidewalk Committee: Councilman Rippy reported the Committee met on January 17<sup>th</sup> with a lot of good conversation. The list of wants and needs is worked through at every meeting. The list contains street repairs, signage, etc. and we try to eliminate somethings off the list and sometimes the list grows.

Utility Board: Councilman Chandler reported the January 21, 2019, Utility Board minutes are enclosed. He also reported IMPA Commissioner Klein and Utility Manager Boyer attended the IMPA 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday Workshop regarding Disaster Recovery. Chandler reported there will be a meeting with Comcast Officials to expand broadband services within Tipton County. MVH Restricted Fund – Clerk-Treasurer: Clerk-Treasurer Clark reported the Indiana General Assembly through House Enrolled Act (HEA) 1002-2017 & HEA 1290-2018 requires a new sub-fund of Motor Vehicle Highway (MVH) referred to as MVH Restricted. Starting January 1, 2019, the political subdivision must post a minimum of 50% of the MVH distribution to MVH Restricted. The MVH Restricted Fund is restricted monies that can be spent on construction, reconstruction and preservation purposes only. The MVH Fund monies are not as restricted. The political subdivision, by ordinance or resolution, may elect to allocate more than 50% of the distribution to the MVH Restricted Fund. As Clerk-Treasurer, my recommendation is to post the minimum of 50% required and leave the other 50% in the MVH Fund which is not as restricted. Clerk-Treasurer Clark requested for the Council to provide her direction by a motion and passage. Councilman Morgan made a motion to authorize the MVH Restricted Fund in accordance with State Statute and the minimum requirement of the State Statute, seconded by Councilman Rippy, with all in favor.

## Resolutions & Ordinances:

Resolution 2019-02 – A Final Resolution Declaring An Economic Revitalization Area And Supporting A Property Tax Abatement For Peerless Realty, LLC Within The City Of Tipton Corporate Limits: Councilman Curnutt made a motion to approve Resolution

2019-02, seconded by Councilman Chandler. Councilman Curnutt reported he surveyed some homeowners and they were very welcomed with Peerless building there. Mayor Havens asked if this was the last action required. P3 Consultant, Nathan Kring stated yes, the final resolution and Clerk-Treasurer will give me copies to give to the applicant. Ordinance 2019-01 – An Ordinance Of The City Of Tipton Providing That The Zoning Ordinance Of The City Of Tipton, Tipton County, Indiana Be Amended By Changing An Established Zone To Zone Classification: Councilman Curnutt made a motion to approve Ordinance 2019-01 on first reading, seconded by Councilman Rippy. It was reported this is changing a B-2 Business District classification to R-1 Single-Family Residential District classification. This is immediately north and adjoining the Vet Clinic.
