Resolution BOC2019-01 Materiality Threshold

RESOLUTION # BOC 2019-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF TIPTON COUNTY, INDIANA ESTABLISHING A MATERIALITY THREASHOLD FOR REPORTING IRREGULARITIES, VARIANCES, SHORTAGES, LOSSES, AND THEFT OF FUNDS

WHEREAS, Indiana Code ("I.C.") Section 5-11-1-27(j) requires a materiality policy for reporting irregularities, variances, shortages, losses, and theft of funds; and,

WHEREAS, I.C. Section 5-11-1-27(I) requires any known misappropriation of funds be reported in writing to the State Board of Accounts and the local Prosecuting Attorney; and,

WHEREAS, there is no materiality threshold applicable to I.C. Section 5-11-1-27(I); and, **WHEREAS**, Tipton County does not have a materiality threshold policy in place; and,

WHEREAS, written notification is required when a public entity is aware of a wrongful and knowing misuse of public funds, regardless of the amount missing or misappropriated; and,

WHEREAS, in order to efficiently comply with I.C. Section 5-11-1-27(j) and I.C. Section 5-11-1-27(l), and resolve any gap in its interpretation, the Tipton County Board of Commissioners (hereafter the "BOC") should establish a threshold amount, under which, automatic and immediate reporting would not be required, unless such misappropriation is determined by the County to be deliberate and knowingly unauthorized.

NOW THEREFORE, the BOC does now establish the threshold amount for automatic and immediate reporting of shortages, losses, variances, irregularities and potential thefts, to be the amount of three hundred dollars (\$300.00), under which, immediate reporting shall not be required, unless the County, after initial investigation, determines such shortage to be potentially deliberate and knowingly unauthorized. Any amount in excess of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) shall immediately be reported to the State Board of Accounts and the local Prosecuting Attorney for further investigation, regardless of intent.

He reported that they are patching road cuts and cutting brush and will be starting work on small structures, weather permitting, this week.

Engineer – Phil Beer

Professional Services Agreement with USI

County Engineer Beer presented the 2019 Agreement for Professional Services between Tipton County and USI Consultants, Inc. The terms remain the same as 2018 with a monthly fee of \$3,300, and a total not to exceed \$39,600.00 for 2019.

Motion by Commissioner Henderson to renew the agreement with USI Consultants, Inc.. Second by Commissioner Manier. Motion carries.

Landfill

Engineer Beer reported that IDEM has determined that Cell #2 is in violation. A new finger system will be assembled by the Highway Department and installed with pea gravel to correct the situation. He also reported that the guardrail project has been completed and all looks well.

Small Structure Inspection Agreement with USI

Motion by Commissioner Henderson to approve the Small Structure Inventory Inspection Agreement for Professional Services with USI Consultants, Inc., not to exceed \$75,000. Second by Commissioner Manier.

Motion carries.

Sheriff – Tony Frawley

Sheriff Frawley introduced Kevin Stiner, the new Courthouse Security special deputy. He also stated that he and Sergeant Evan Smith will be conducting a conference call at 2pm with Enterprise Fleet Management.

Motion by Commissioner Henderson to authorize Sheriff Frawley to order four 2020 Ford Explorers at \$32,789.34 each, from Tipton Ford, pending the outcome of the discussion with Enterprise Fleet Management. Second by Commissioner Manier. Motion carries.

Sheriff Frawley stated that he intends to wholesale the older vehicles, rather than use them as trade-ins.

Surplus Equipment

Motion by Commissioner Henderson to authorize the Auditor to declare surplus equipment, as requested the Health, Prosecutor, and Clerk Departments and to make arrangements for disposal. Second by Commissioner Manier. Motion carries.

Jail – Bill Shepler with PMSI

Commissioners approved the water loop extension at the jail site, at a cost of \$237,721.00., but rejected the addition to the Jail sally port.

There was discussion of the fate of the old jail once the new jail is occupied. The Commissioners asked PMSI to take a look at the damage in the old part of the Jail.

Ambulance Board

President Mullins stated that there may be a need to disband the current ambulance board and reestablish a new board. He asked the Auditor to locate the current Seals contract for review.
